WORSHIP AND ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

We welcome children in our worship, and we recognize and value the fact that children are wonderfully spontaneous. If you wish, you may make use of the soft space in the West Transept, with an open carpeted area and baskets of soft toys and books (the West Transept is near the front, to the left if you are facing the altar). There is also a more private room, known as the Bride's Room, off of the East Transept, where you may go if you need that type of facility. There is also nursery care available at no charge from 8:30AM until 12:30PM in the Children's Center.

On second Sundays at 9:15AM, we have a special "Comfy Space" service for those who tend to wiggle during worship and those who worship with them, held in the Children's Chapel. During the school year, the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atriums are open for Children's Formation (Rooms 6,7 and 8 in the Children's Center) and Youth Groups meet in La Parroquia at 10:15AM.

Communion

All are welcome to come forward at the time of Communion. The standard practice in the Episcopal Church is that those who are Baptized are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you are visiting today and are not Baptized but are feeling drawn to receive Communion, we hope that you will come forward and receive, and that afterwards you will talk to one of the clergy about Baptism and what it means both to take Bread and to become part of the Body.

If you don't want to receive communion or are unsure, you are more than welcome to come forward for a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.

If you have a food sensitivity that requires a **gluten-free Communion Wafer**, simply mention that to the clergy person administering Communion. The receptacle containing the gluten-free Hosts will be brought to you, and you may help yourself to a Host (to avoid cross-contamination). To receive the Wine, you may either drink from the common Chalice or hold it for the Chalice Minister to intinct for you and place on your tongue. For those who have difficulty approaching the Communion rail, you have the option of **receiving Communion in your seat**. Simply notify an usher, or ask a parishioner seated near you to notify an usher for you.

Restrooms

Restrooms are located in the hallway north of the Murphey Gallery, across the Fishpond Garden and up the walkway from the Church. There is a diaper changing table in the gender-neutral ADA-compliant restroom there. Changing tables are also found in both the men's and women's restrooms in the Music Center.

Accessibility

This facility is **fully accessible**. Please speak to an usher if you need assistance. The main area of the Church, forward of the choir stalls, is **looped** to assist those who have difficulty hearing. If you have a T-coil in your hearing aid, you may sit anywhere in this section and hear via the amplification system. **Hearing assist devices** are also available from the ushers. These are operational anywhere in the Church. The ushers will ask for your car keys as a reminder to return the device. **Large print copies** of the Book of Common Prayer are available from the ushers for your use during the service.

Kirkin' of Tartans

The Scottish Episcopal Church and the Episcopal Church of the United States share an important historical relationship, as the first post-revolutionary American bishop was consecrated by Scottish Bishops in 1784. Each year on the last Sunday before Advent (Christ the King), we invite you to bring tartans to be blessed, and to hear Scottish music performed by the Tucson Pipers at the 9:00AM and 11:15AM services.

Day of Discernment 2020

The annual Day of Ministry Discernment (DMD) will be held on March 21, 2020 at St. Barnabas on the Desert (Scottsdale). In the past, the DMD has been held the first weekend in May. This was often the official "launch" for those pursuing formal discernment for Holy Orders in the Episcopal Church. The Commission on Ministry heard a desire for Parish Discernment Committees to have more time together as a team: to listen

for the Spirit together, to build trust amongst each other, to let the questions and conversation have time for maturing so the fullness of a discerner's gifts, hopes, and spirit can be deeply understood. We hope to make the 2021 DMD in early February expanding the timeline even further.

The Day of Ministry Discernment is open to all who are discerning any role in the church: ordained or lay. The vision of the Commission on Ministry is to spend the coming seasons both continuing to support those exploring ordained leadership, and to expand our formation and growth opportunities for lay ministers throughout the Diocese. In today's world as church members, our ministries must serve those who come to our church buildings as well as those who are outside of our buildings. We are called to go beyond our churches and spread the good news in a culture that is less and less Christian. We are to be manifestations of Christ as teachers, servants, listeners, challengers, and healers.

As we become more engaged with our neighbors, the ministries of our churches need to support and promote a renewed orientation toward leadership of 'all stripes and types,' as our Presiding Bishop says! This means the Church needs leaders, lay and ordained, who are entrepreneurial, collaborative, adaptive, diverse and spiritually trustworthy.

The expanded discernment process in the Diocese of Arizona is designed to provide greater access to explore ministry and I eadership in many forms through this initial Day of Ministry Discernment. Participants learn a theological model for vocation that gives them a framework for their own discernment. They explore a variety of Christian vocations, are allowed time for personal reflection and prayer, and can learn about the canonical processes for ordained ministry in the Diocese of Arizona.

Registration for the DMD will begin on January 15 through the Diocesan website. When you register, you'll be asked to begin discerning before you even arrive! We will send you links to some self-assessments in regard to your spiritual gifts that you will complete and bring with you to the DMD. These assessments form the groundwork for the Day of Ministry Discernment: how can any of us know where God is calling us if we don't know what God's put in us to use for the Kingdom?

You'll also be asked to bring with you a spouse/friend/support person who knows you well and can walk alongside you as you discern. Lastly, you'll be asked to bring a Priest-in-Charge or other leader from your parish. Their work will be to get to know your gifts more closely so they can be working with you in your personal discernment as well. We look forward to seeing you on March 21, 2020 at the Day of Ministry Discernment.
