As you participate in the liturgy, know that it is customary to cross oneself at the moments indicated by \maltese and to bow at mention of the Holy Trinity (as indicated by italics). This is not required; you are encouraged to participate in whatever way is meaningful for you.

Please stand as the Ministers and Choir enter.

Apostles' Creed (sung by all, standing)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life \maltese everlasting. Amen.
