### WORSHIP AND ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

We welcome children in our worship, and we recognize and value the fact that children are wonderfully spontaneous. If you wish, you may make use of the soft space in the West Transept, with an open carpeted area and baskets of soft toys and books (the West Transept is near the front, to the left if you are facing the altar). There is also a more private room, known as the Bride's Room, off of the East Transept, where you may go if you need that type of facility. There is also nursery care available at no charge from 8:30am until 12:30pm in the Children's Center.

On second Sundays at 9:15am, we have a special "Comfy Space" service for those who tend to wiggle during worship and those who worship with them, held in the Children's Chapel. During the school year, Church School and Youth Groups meet at 10:15am.

### COMMUNION

All are welcome to come forward at the time of Communion. The standard practice in the Episcopal Church is that those who are Baptized are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you are visiting today and are not Baptized but are feeling drawn to receive Communion, we hope that you will come forward and receive, and that afterwards you will talk to one of the clergy about Baptism and what it means both to take Bread and to become part of the Body.

If you don't want to receive communion or are unsure, you are more than welcome to come forward for a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.

If you have a food sensitivity that requires a **low-gluten Communion Wafer**, simply mention that to the clergy person administering Communion. The receptacle containing the low-gluten Hosts will be brought to you, and you may help yourself to a Host (to avoid cross-contamination). You may either drink from the common Chalice or hold it for the Chalice Minister to intinct for you and place on your tongue. For those who have difficulty approaching the Communion rail, you have the option of **receiving Communion in your seat**. Simply notify an usher, or ask a parishioner seated near you to notify an usher for you.

### RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located in the hallway north of the Murphey Gallery, across the Fishpond Garden and up the walkway from the Church. There is a diaper changing table in the gender-neutral ADA-compliant restroom there. Changing tables are also found in both the men's and women's restrooms in the Music Center.

### ACCESSIBILITY

This facility is **fully accessible**. Please speak to an usher if you need assistance. The main area of the Church, forward of the choir stalls, is **looped** to assist those who have difficulty hearing. If you have a T-coil in your hearing aid, you may sit anywhere in this section and hear via the amplification system. **Hearing assist devices** are also available from the ushers. These are operational anywhere in the Church. The ushers will ask for your car keys as a reminder to return the device. **Large print copies** of the Book of Common Prayer are available from the ushers for your use during the service.

### ***"Our Sister's Keeper" – Women's Stories***

Saint Philip's will host a powerful photographic exhibit "Our Sisters Keeper", by artist and educator, Dr. Marie Plakos, from Sunday August 5, 2018 to October 21, 2018. This exhibit opened last year as a one woman exhibit at the Carter Presidential Museum in Atlanta, Georgia.

Dr. Plakos has traveled the world, including Mexico, Peru, Ghana, and India, capturing the beauty and strength of women and girls living in challenging conditions. Her photography illustrates the beauty and strength of women even though they face the many challenges of economic hardships, hunger, lack of adequate health care, and physical abuse. She feels that "human rights must exist for everyone living on this planet and for women and girls to have a better life. Our life interdependence demands this, and that is why we must be our sister's keeper."

This is a very crucial exhibit for the times in which we live. Please mark your calendars for viewing these compelling photographs and become informed of the worldwide challenges facing women today. Further details on exhibit hours and supporting events will be published shortly.

## ***Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos***

Dear Saint Philip's,

I have some exciting Outreach news for you! In the fall we will have visitors - people who are our neighbors, and will hopefully become our friends! Saint Philip's is the first church in Tucson to be a host parish for this organization, Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH-Spanish for "Our Little Brothers and Sisters"). From September 26th-October 3rd, a group of about fifteen teenagers will join our community.

Founded in 1954, NPH is fully supporting more than 3,100 boys and girls in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua and Peru. An additional 3,100 community children receive scholarships, meals, health care and other support. More than 140,000 services were provided through community outreach programs in 2017.

Founded in 1965, NPH USA transforms the lives of vulnerable children in Latin America and the Caribbean by supporting the homes, health services, and educational programs of Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos. Together, they help children overcome poverty and become leaders in their own communities.

Each year, NPH USA arranges for student performers from an NPH home to travel to the United States for their Pequeño Tour. The Estudiantina Troupe of NPH Mexico will be in Tucson and Phoenix performing at various events from September 26th–October 9th, 2017. Over 10,000 people will be touched by the tour. Proceeds from the Pequeño Tour will help to provide basic needs—food, clothing, shelter, health care, and education for the thousands of children at NPH.

As a host parish, one of our roles is to provide host families who open their homes and hearts to two or three guests from NPH during the time they are hosted by the parish. This is a wonderful opportunity for your family to participate in a multi-cultural exchange and get to know the children in a special way. If you are interested in learning more about being a host family, please be in touch. This will be arranged by a host family coordinator, so do not feel that transportation has to be a barrier, it is typically just a bit in the morning and evening. The Pequeños are scheduled throughout the day to visit local schools, the University of Arizona, the Mexican Consulate, etc. If you are interested in any of these opportunities, please be in touch with me, and I will loop you into future meetings with the planning team. Knowledge of Spanish is not required. Some training is provided before the Pequeños arrive, and background checks are required.

On Saturday, September 29th, we are planning a fundraiser for NPH that will involve a concert featuring Missa Criolla composed by Ariel Ramírez, food, and festivities. If you would like to help plan such an event, or have contacts that would be interested in participating in putting items in a raffle or in other efforts, please be in touch.

On Sunday, September 30th, there will be some information shared about NPH, and Pequeños will be available to talk about their experiences. Sponsorships of children and direct support will be welcomed on this day, with information available in the Perry Garden.

I am excited for this opportunity to get to know our neighbors in this way, and to learn from NPH's longstanding ministry with vulnerable children. Please pray for NPH and its ministry. If you have any questions or would like to get involved, please call or email me.
