### WORSHIP AND ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

We welcome children in our worship, and we recognize and value the fact that children are wonderfully spontaneous. If you wish, you may make use of the soft space in the West Transept, with an open carpeted area and baskets of soft toys and books (the West Transept is near the front, to the left if you are facing the altar). There is also a more private room, known as the Bride's Room, off of the East Transept, where you may go if you need that type of facility. There is also nursery care available at no charge from 8:30am until 12:30pm in the Children's Center.

On second Sundays at 9:15am, we have a special "Comfy Space" service for those who tend to wiggle during worship and those who worship with them, held in the Children's Chapel. During the school year, Church School and Youth Groups meet at 10:15am.

### COMMUNION

All are welcome to come forward at the time of Communion. The standard practice in the Episcopal Church is that those who are Baptized are welcome to receive Holy Communion. If you are visiting today and are not Baptized but are feeling drawn to receive Communion, we hope that you will come forward and receive, and that afterwards you will talk to one of the clergy about Baptism and what it means both to take Bread and to become part of the Body.

If you don't want to receive communion or are unsure, you are more than welcome to come forward for a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest.

If you have a food sensitivity that requires a **low-gluten Communion Wafer**, simply mention that to the clergy person administering Communion. The receptacle containing the low-gluten Hosts will be brought to you, and you may help yourself to a Host (to avoid cross-contamination). You may either drink from the common Chalice or hold it for the Chalice Minister to intinct for you and place on your tongue. For those who have difficulty approaching the Communion rail, you have the option of **receiving Communion in your seat**. Simply notify an usher, or ask a parishioner seated near you to notify an usher for you.

### RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located in the hallway north of the Murphey Gallery, across the Fishpond Garden and up the walkway from the Church. There is a diaper changing table in the gender-neutral ADA-compliant restroom there. Changing tables are also found in both the men's and women's restrooms in the Music Center.

### ACCESSIBILITY

This facility is **fully accessible**. Please speak to an usher if you need assistance. The main area of the Church, forward of the choir stalls, is **looped** to assist those who have difficulty hearing. If you have a T-coil in your hearing aid, you may sit anywhere in this section and hear via the amplification system. **Hearing assist devices** are also available from the ushers. These are operational anywhere in the Church. The ushers will ask for your car keys as a reminder to return the device. **Large print copies** of the Book of Common Prayer are available from the ushers for your use during the service.

## Upcoming Events

### ***Holy Week and Easter Services***

It's only two weeks until Holy Week begins and only three weeks until Easter Sunday, and we are excited about all the opportunities for worship that we will be offering this year here at Saint Philip's.

On March 25th, join us for Palm Sunday as we remember both Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and his passion and death on the cross. The Liturgy of the Palms for the 9:00am service will begin across River Road at Saint Philip's Plaza at 8:45am, followed by a procession to the Church. At the 11:15am service, the Liturgy of the Palms will take place in our own Labyrinth Plaza. All other services will begin in their usual locations.

This year we will have services on each of the days of Holy Week. On Monday and Tuesday, join us for a service of the Holy Eucharist at 7:00pm. On Wednesday we will gather for Stations of the Cross at 5:30pm, followed by a simple supper and introduction to Holy Week by our guest preacher, Fr. Scott Gunn, and concluding with a candlelight service of Tenebrae at 7:00pm.

The three days of Triduum begin on the evening of Maundy Thursday, March 29th, as we gather at 7:00pm to celebrate Christ's institution of the Holy Eucharist, recall his example of loving servant leadership in the washing of feet, and reflect on the betrayal and desertion he faced from his closest friends. This marks the beginning of a single "liturgy" that does not truly end until Easter itself begins - the continuation of our worship is marked, among other ways, by the tradition of keeping vigil at an altar of repose overnight, watching and praying with Christ. At 12:00pm on Good Friday, March 30th, we will remember Christ's willing suffering and death for our sake and the sake of the world. At 8:30am on March 31st we will observe a simple service of morning prayer, and hear an ancient homily for Holy Saturday.

As the sun sets on Saturday, we will prepare for the Easter Vigil, which this year will begin at 8:00pm. Together we will hear the story of our salvation from the time of creation through Christ's resurrection, will remember the lives of the Saints who share in Christ's resurrected life, and will welcome new members into the Body of Christ in Baptism.

On Easter Sunday we will celebrate the Eucharist together at our usual service times, with the addition of a 6:00am sunrise service in the Columbarium Garden and a 9:15am family service in the Children's Courtyard. If you have any questions, please contact the parish office or any member of the clergy. We look forward to celebrating these holy days with you and your loved ones!
